Origin of the Universities of the Third Age and U3A Ringwood

The first University of the Third Age (U3A) was established at the University of Toulouse, France in 1972 and by 1982 had become established in a modified form in Britain.

The introduction of the University of the Third Age movement to Australia arose from a public meeting held in Melbourne in July 1984.

From this meeting the U3A City of Melbourne was formed on 26th July 1984.

Interest in the concept of a University of the Third Age grew and U3A Hawthorn was created on 13th November 1984.

The very first courses on offer at a U3A in Australia were provided by U3A City of Melbourne in March 1985.

The majority of these courses were traditional academic subjects in the Humanities, including Art Appreciation, Clear Thinking, Current Affairs, Australian and European History, Philosophy, Literature, Music/Opera, Languages, Genealogy and Social Science Studies. Self-confidence was to be encouraged through Public Speaking. The U3A movement received a great deal of publicity in the daily newspapers and radio interviews and membership of this first U3A grew to 1100 within three years.

In 1985 two more U3As were created-- U3A Monash (now U3A Waverley) on 12th February1985 and U3A Ringwood, on 26th March 1985.

In respect of U3A Ringwood, approximately 200 people attended a public meeting called by the Ringwood City Council at the Ringwood Cultural Centre on 6th March 1985, to canvass the creation of a U3A in the City of Ringwood. This meeting was chaired by the then Mayor, Councillor Gardini and guest speakers were Clifton Picton (COTA) and Dr Jack McDonell (Monash University).

As a result of this meeting, a committee of management was established and U3A Ringwood (then titled Third Age Ringwood) officially came into being on 26 March 1985. When the first classes commenced at U3A Ringwood on 17th June 1985, they included English Literature, Poetry, Craft, Play Reading, British History, Photography and Armchair Travel. Sometime later Psychology and Philosophy were added.

U3A Ringwood started with 44 members and by November 1985 this had risen to 120, and additional courses in Computers, Public Speaking, Mixed Antiquities, Music Appreciation and Art were introduced.

U3A Ringwood is unique, being the first local government sponsored U3A in Australia.

U3A Ringwood was instrumental in spreading the U3A message by assisting in the creation of a U3A in the then neighbouring City of Croydon, as well as in many regional areas of Victoria.

Today, U3As not only encourage people who have retired or are semi-retired to attend classes that may contribute to their physical and mental wellbeing, but help them with the challenges of living in the new digital age, as well as providing opportunities for social interaction.

U3A Ringwood, is run entirely through the efforts of volunteers, has around 300 members and conducts more than 35 courses for members

The annual membership fee is currently \$60.00 which is set at a level intended to maximise the opportunity for people to become members, irrespective of their financial status.

The over 50 years of age demographic comprise just under 40% of the total population of the City of Maroondah and is the fastest growing demographic not only in the City of Maroondah but in Australia.

Initially, the growth of U3A Ringwood was curtailed due to a critical lack of (suitable) accommodation. However, things changed dramatically in 2015 when Maroondah Council provided U3A Ringwood new modern accommodation at the Parkwood Community Hub (previously Parkwood Secondary College) at 35 -39 Tortice Drive, Ringwood North and at the Kevin Pratt Pavilion (Norwood Sporting Club) 58 - 60 Mullum Mullum Road, Ringwood. U3A Ringwood also holds a line dancing class and at the 4th Ringwood Scouts Hall in Ringwood

All our current locations provide good parking and have bus services virtually at the door or nearby.

U3A Ringwood aims to contribute to the wellbeing (mental and physical) of mature aged people (nominally 45 years and over) who are no longer full time in the workforce, by providing the widely recognised basic elements for healthy aging, being mental stimulation, physical activities, social interaction and interesting things to do.

LOCATIONS

U3A Ringwood operates out of three premises.

Parkwood Community Hub

35-39 Tortice Drive Ringwood North



Our primary location and our office are located in the Parkwood Community Hub building at 35-39 Tortice Drive Ringwood North. The building was extensively refurbished by Maroondah City Council, and became our prime site, in 2015.

Kevin Pratt Pavilion/Norwood Sporting Club

58-60 Mullum-Mullum Road Ringwood, Vic 3134



We hold most of our larger and activity-based classes at Kevin Pratt Pavilion (also known as the Norwood Sporting Club building) located at 58-60 Mullum-Mullum Road, Ringwood. There are two entrances. The upper-level entry is via the front steps. The lower-level entry is on your left just a few metres down the driveway/walkway that is between the building and the oval.

4th Ringwood Scout Hall (Mines Road, Ringwood)

17 Mines Road, Ringwood East



We hold our Line Dancing class at the 4th Ringwood Scout Group Hall located at 17 Mines Road Ringwood East (opposite the Karralyka Centre).
